Gifford Hancock bequeathed money to the Edithburgh Football Club and it has been used to set this room up. The room was opened this same weekend of August 11th and 12th by some of his children, from left to right, Di Hiscock, John Hancock, Neil Hancock and Janet Tucker watched by Andrew Johnson extreme left.

Who was Gifford Hancock? A past player who began playing for Edithburgh in 1944 and who at 19 played in the side which won the 1956 premiership. He do not miss a single game in 17 years. Became a trainer after retiring and became a club patron in 1966, a position he held until the Edithburgh Football Club amalgamated in 1993. He was awarded life membership of the Edithburgh Football Club in 1958 for the services he gave over many years.

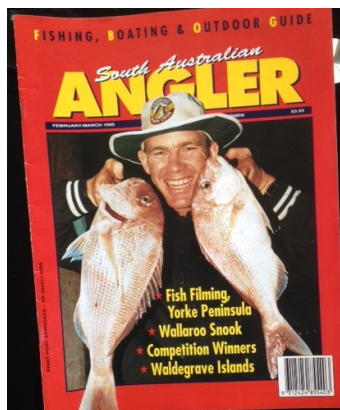

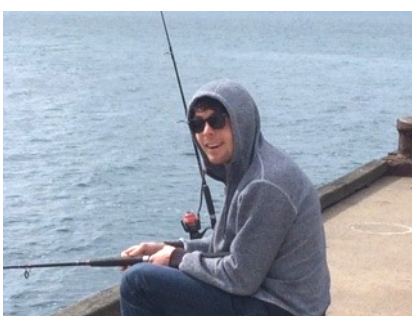

GARLIC PRAWNS

INGREDIENTS:-

(double up etc for more),

12 deveined, and shelled green (means raw) prawns per person, knob of butter and a squirt of olive oil, ½ cup full cream, good pinch of dry chicken stock powder, 1 chopped spring onion, ¼ tsp white pepper, 2 cloves crushed and chopped garlic, ½ tsp cornflour mixed with water, enough cooked rice for all your guests.

METHOD:-

Heat your frypan to medium high heat, add butter and oil, toss in prawns and garlic, and fry till starting to turn pink, do not burn the garlic, or it will go bitter, add the chicken stock powder and pepper, stir one min, add cream, and heat the cooked rice in the nuke (microwave), stir the prawns for 2 mins, and add cornflour mix ,stir 30 secs and toss in spring onions, turn prawns off, arrange rice nicely, divvy up the prawns and the garlicky sauce. Pour a beer or a wine, coz your done.

TIPZ:-

Imagine this on top of a real nice steak, or juicy chicken breast, or use scallops, or razor fish hearts, Australian salmon fillets are beautiful grilled with garlic sauce, a nice garden salad and baked potato. I reckon just cook what you like

EDITHBURGH PROGRESS ASSOCIATION AGM 14th AUGUST 2018

On Tuesday 14th August the Edithburgh Progress Association Inc. held its Annual General Meeting. Prior to the meeting there was a lot of community interest and discussion. However nobody could have predicted a crowd in excess of 120 people. Also in attendance were the Mayor, 3 councillors and an issuing officer to ensure the proceedings ran smoothly and fairly.

The successful candidates were Pat Bartram, Peter Bartram, Kerry Dawes, Gary Weekley and Mark Wilkin. Congratulations all.

The attending community members should also be applauded for their interest shown and their tolerance for each others differing points of view. The minutes and reports from the meeting are available for viewing at the post office.

CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT FOR EDITHBURGH PROGRESS ASSOCIATION AGM 14th AUGUST 2018 AT 7.30PM.

Welcome to the Annual General Meeting of the Edithburgh Progress Association.

- Darryl and Andrew Lewis approached Progress in September 2017 with a vision to paint a large mural at the Tidal Pool. Progress supported this initiative and Darryl and Andrew designed, planned and painted and, in early 2018, Council employees installed the new mural at the Tidal Pool. This project was a fantastic collaboration between Darryl, Andrew, Progress, Council and the local School children who supplied 300 handprints. We can all agree it has been a fantastic addition to the Pool and a point of interest for tourists. A huge thank you to both Darryl and Andrew for their inspiration.
- The Hermannsburg Aboriginal Art Exhibition was an initiative of John Edwards and Roger Hogben. This Art exhibition featured works from 2nd generation Hermannsburg school artists including water colours and dot paintings. The Exhibition took 6 months to organise and coordinate and was held in the Institute over the Australia Day weekend in January - \$517.10 was raised for the Tidal Pool. Well done to all involved.
- A Day at the Burgh held their inaugural event in November 2016 and was again a huge success last November. The 2017 even saw a very colourful event with flags, umbrellas and bunting and a major sponsor came on board - AGL. AGL has again confirmed their sponsorship for the 2018 event, with a commitment of \$3,000. Well done to all the volunteers who work tirelessly for months to organise this event. Organisation and promotion is well underway for 2018! It is truly wonderful to see Edithburgh come alive and bring a boost to our local economy.
- A \$2,500 grant was received from Yorke Peninsula Council to be put towards solar lighting on the Town Entrance Signs which will be installed shortly.
- The Edithburgh markets held in the Institute every 2nd Sunday of the month are doing very well. Progress has supported this initiative by paying for the Hall Hire and replacement signage. Pat Bartram is doing wonders with her lamington sales as a fundraiser for the Edithburgh Tidal Pool's ongoing upgrades. Thanks so much Pat!
- Edithburgh Progress made contact with the Friends of Yorketown Hospital. They forwarded the Hospital's wish list to Progress and a donation was subsequently made of a Visiano LED Ceiling Mounted Examination light (\$3,159.20). We know this will go to very good use and are pleased to have been able to make this donation.
- Edithburgh Progress Association also contributed \$10K as an extra allocation to Council to help complete the new fencing at the tidal pool and \$5K contribution towards bitumising the carpark.
- The Matthew Flinders Plaque and memorial upgrade was also completed in the last half of 2017. A huge thank you to Laurie Grech for your hard work and dedication to this job!
- A motion of confidence was moved praising the work done by the Admin and Finance Officers.
- Progress also purchased a second-hand ute for the Flora Park. The Park is a wonderful place to take a walk and is beautifully maintained by volunteers, so well done to you all.
- A new Defibrillator is now located at Barbara Freidenfelt's carport at Sultana Point. Thank you, Barbara, for allowing the defibrillator to be placed at your home.
- Edithburgh Community Grants - \$1,220 was donated to Seafarers Flying Angel Centre (Memorial Garden). \$830 donated to the Edithburgh Museum - Flinders Memorial and ventilation for the sheds and \$950 donated to Edithburgh Tennis Club for Rainwater Tank replacement.
- New Caravan Park Managers have been appointed. This was a lengthy process, but it was worth the wait. Jo & Phillip Medson will be taking on the role next week, commencing 20th August. A HUGE thank you to our Relief Management team, Ken & Lisa Taylor. We offered them a 6 week term to manage the park which turned into four and a half months, but we are extremely grateful for the assistance that you have brought to the park.
- Terri Thiel has been living in Edithburgh for past 12 years with sons Cale and Brodie. Cale was selected in the First XI cricket team to tour Sri Lanka at the end of June for 2 weeks. Edithburgh Progress contributed \$750 towards the cost of Cale's trip as per our Sponsorship's policy.
- The Sculpture Exhibition held at the Edithburgh Institute, which was part of a three-tiered Yorke Peninsula Art Exhibition held over the Easter Weekend, attracted around 1000 visitors to Edithburgh and was a fantastic boost to Edithburgh's businesses and other attractions.

- Channel 7 Adelaide and The Today Shows both did live weather crosses from Edithburgh during 2017-2018 and highlighted the town and the new mural at the Tidal Pool for all of SA and Australia to see.
- Our annual Volunteer morning tea was again held this year at the Location Café during Volunteer Week on 25 May 2018 thanking all volunteers in and around Edithburgh for their huge contributions to the Edithburgh community. The Premiers Certificate for Outstanding Volunteer Service was awarded to two of our Committee members - Keryn Dawes and Peter Bartram. Without volunteers like Keryn and Peter and all of you who have contributed years of dedicated service to a number of organisations within Edithburgh and the surrounding school communities, our rural communities would not exist. So again, thank you to the many volunteers who work tirelessly for the benefit of Edithburgh and the community.

The past nine months have been tough for all involved at Progress with the Committee facing several challenges during this time. In March 2018, a Planning Day was held with all Members where new ideas and initiatives were discussed. The meeting generated many positive outcomes and thoughts for new town projects, community events, grants and community asset upgrades.

But most importantly, Progress want and will work towards building community spirit and involvement. An ideas flyer is being circulated to all residents with a post office box, asking your thoughts and ideas on how to help improve Edithburgh and surrounding areas. This is the first step towards building a better community where we all work together for the same outcome - a better Edithburgh. Finally thank you Ann for all your patience and support this year.

I would like to welcome you all to the Annual General Meeting of the Coobowie Progress Association
20/08/2018

We have had a very busy year.

- The landscaping project at the Information Bay has now been completed with the boats, ketch, mural and signage in place. This was an overall cost of approximately \$14000.00 covered by Progress.
- The tidy-up of the Hall surrounds began once we received a "Grant" to remove trees and rubbish so we could start with a clean slate. As you can see the Gabiens have been put in place and a Heritage stone wall at the entrance to the Hall has been completed. The final design has been approved by the committee subject to costings.
- The Progress Association committed itself to \$55000.00 for resurfacing of the Coobowie Tennis Courts if we were unable to obtain a Grant to assist this project. On 15th August we received notification that our application was successful. Thanks Ann for the time you spent on this.
- In the Caravan Park we have done the following:
 - Access ramps on cabins 7 & 8
 - Replaced lounges & dining settings where necessary.
 - Refurbishing & painting cabins 1,2,3,4 & 5.
 - Painting interiors of cabins 7,8,9 & 10
 - New floor coverings in cabins 7 & 8.
 - Installed new concrete steps from hill powered sites to bottom powered sites.
 - Replaced outdoor settings when required.
 - This was at a cost of approx. \$80000.00

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Glennis and Ann for all the work they have done. They have spent many hours over their paid time.

Bron & Steve. Thank you for managing the Park.

Thank you to our community members who have helped at working bees & volunteered their time when required. A special Thank You to Malcolm Stanton for painting chairs & bed frames & Ken Taylor for cleaning town BBQs.
